This year is an election year for all positions on the Mid-West Conference board. Below is Standing Rule #3 which outlines our process:

• MWRC officers shall consist of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary/Treasurer, and International Representative. The officers shall serve two (2) year terms and shall be elected at the Fall Conference meeting during even numbered years. Candidates must declare (in writing) the office they seek to the MWRC Secretary/Treasurer prior to the adjournment of the Spring Conference meeting of the election year. No later than August 1st of the election year the MWRC Secretary/Treasurer will provide the President of each MWRC Chapter with a list of the candidates for each office. This is meant to allow the Chapter President to confer with his membership prior to the voting.

While talking about work obligations and conference elections for this year, it is with a heavy heart I have decided that I will NOT be running for re-election as your Vice Chairman. I have had a great time working as the Vice Chairman of this great conference and met a lot of great people but do not feel like with my work schedule, I can give the position the time it deserves. From the M.W.R.C. Secretary / Treasurer Duane Potter Wow, by the time you read this, it will be mid April already. The days on the calendar keep flying by and it will be the end of June and our Spring Conference, before we know it.

2024 brings with it Conference elections. Standing Rule #3 states the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary / Treasurer and the International Representative shall serve a two-year term and shall be elected at the

Fall President's meeting. Members seeking one of the four positions shall notify the Secretary, in writing, by the close of the Spring President's meeting of the election year.

MWRC Standing Rule #4 requires each Chapter to pay the MWRC dues of \$1.00 (US) per chapter member, up to a maximum of \$25.00 per year. As of the writing of this article only 12 Chapters have forwarded their dues. That leaves 19 Chapters that have not paid for 2024. There is still time to mail them, or you can bring them to the Spring Conference.

Speaking of the Spring Conference, I am looking forward to seeing everyone June 20th to June 23rd in Lawrence, KS. You have until May 1st to get your registration into Kansas III before the rate goes up. I have faith that Kansas III will be throwing one heck of a party.

Looking to the future, the Fall Conference will be in Spearfish, SD September 5th through the 8th. This conference is being hosted by South Dakota I and will also be their 40th Anniversary.

No Chapter has submitted a bid to host either conference in 2025. If your Chapter is considering hosting one of these conferences, get your bid together and make a presentation at the Spring meeting.

From the M.W.R.C. International Representative Doug Casteel

Since the last newsletter, I represented you at the Blue Knights® International Board of Directors meeting via Zoom

on February 3rd. Here are the highlights from the meeting:

50th **Anniversary Committee** – Currently 251 people are registered. There are 38 people on the waiting list for condos with the majority of those wanting AC, which probably won't happen because it only averages about 75° for daytime highs there that time of year. There are 28 people on the waiting list for the hotel, which also has grim prospects, because it would require a cancellation.

Headquarters Committee – It looks like the pavers for the brick project will be laid sometime in May, so you can still purchase a brick until approximately April 15th. So far the program has raised approximately \$20,000 for the Headquarters fund.

Treasurer – We finished last year approximately \$28,000 in the red, which was mostly due to overages in legal fees because of the lawsuit, drastically increased insurance premiums, and trademark fees.

VP North America – Our current membership stands at 8,044 members in 355 chapters, which looks bad, but there are many that haven't been processed at the office yet because the deadline was only a couple of days ago. There are 59 chapters that haven't even opened their renewals yet. We voted and approved NY XII to renew with only 5 members.

President – There is nothing new to report on the lawsuit. If you are called by the Accidental Death Insurance Company and they keep on trying to sell to you after you tell them no, report it to headquarters. The company tracks which salesman contacts which member, so it can be dealt with if they are overzealous.

Board of Governors – This is an election year for the BOG and if you are interested in running for one of those positions, you will need to submit a letter of intent to the BOG Secretary Pam McClaren before May 1st. The 2025 International Convention will be held in Brussels by BEL VIII. The 2026 International is open and you will need to reach out to the Convention Committee and get the guidelines in order to submit a bid by the May 1st deadline.

Unfinished Business –

• There was a lengthy discussion into the investigation of the unauthorized black back patch that was sold by NY IX. Corrective actions have been taken.

- NY II International Convention Audit is still waiting for an official ruling from the bankruptcy court regarding the host hotel bill.
- Executive Session Guidelines The proposal was approved to outline when it is permissible for the BOD to go into executive session. It passed unanimously.

New Business -

 The following International Honorary Members were submitted and approved unanimously: Christine Fulton, Fred Noe, Joe Ball, King Albert II of Belgium, Maggie Gallant, Former WI Governor Scott Walker, and Terry Pendleton.

The next BOD meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 17, 2024 at 1100 hours ET.

I hope to see you at one of the upcoming Conferences or the International Convention.

Hello fellow Blue Knights! Let's look into our Blue Knights Pledge, which binds us

together as a community of motorcycling law enforcement officers.

In part it says; I pledge, promote motorcycle safety, being an example of safe use, and work to improve relationships with the public. These are just a few words from the pledge, but how can we as Blue Knights, be examples of our club's pledge?

Promote safety. ATGATT. Jacket, gloves, boots and helmet. Mandatory helmet states have less deaths per ratio of crashes than optional helmet states.

Lead by **example of safe use.** Adhere to speed limits, ride with traffic, and avoid risky maneuvers. In our conference, 58% of motorcycle fatalities in 2023 resulted from speed-related, single-vehicle crashes.

Improve relationships with the public. Attend local motorcycle events proudly wearing our Blue Knights colors. Be approachable, engage with the public and answer their questions about our organization. Our interactions shape their views of us.

Let's all do our part and promote our club in a positive way.

I hope to see you at the Spring Conference and at the safety class. I ask that all of you invest just 20 minutes in the safety class. No judgment—only skill improvement. Let's enhance our riding abilities and reinforce our commitment to safety.

Patch collectors, bring some patches and look me up.

STANDING RULES FOR THE MWRC



- 1. Carrying firearms at MWRC events after consuming alcoholic beverages is prohibited. Event hosts are required to provide secure storage for firearms if requested by any attendee.
- 2. All members are entitled to make motions and participate in discussions during Conference meetings. However, only the President (or Regular Member appointed by the President) of each MWRC Chapter in good standing will be allowed to vote on items of business and candidates for office at Conference meetings. Any Chapter which has not paid its annual dues shall not be considered in good standing.



3. MWRC officers shall consist of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary/Treasurer, and International Representative. The officers shall serve two (2) year terms and shall be elected at the Fall Conference meeting during even numbered years. Candidates must declare (in writing) the office they seek to the MWRC Secretary / Treasurer prior to the adjournment of the Spring Conference meeting of the election year. No later than August 1st of the election year the MWRC Secretary / Treasurer will provide the President of each MWRC



Chapter with a list of the candidates for each office. This is meant to allow the Chapter President to confer with his membership prior to the voting.

4. Each Chapter in the MWRC shall pay annual dues to the Conference in the amount of \$1.00 (US) per chapter member, up to a maximum of \$25.00 (US) per year.



- 5. Bids to host MWRC conferences may be accepted up to two (2) years in advance.
- 6. All participants in parades or group rides, at any Blue Knights® Midwest Regional Conference event, must wear an approved motorcycle helmet.





7. The MWRC board will notify any active chapter within 50 miles prior to authorizing a charter to any new chapter, however final determination and approval will reside with the board
